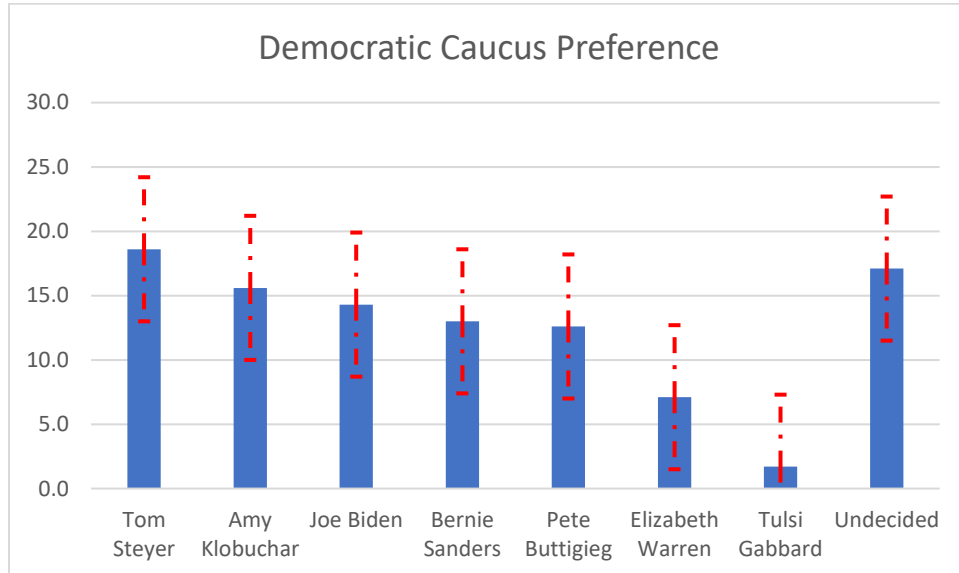


Executive Summary

Tom Steyer leads a tight race in the Nevada Democratic Caucus with a slim 2-point lead, according to a poll commissioned and conducted by Point Blank Political; however, the top five candidates are all within the poll's 5.6 percent margin of error. Steyer, Klobuchar, Biden, Sanders, and Buttigieg led the pack, while Warren and Gabbard were decidedly behind the leaders. Point Blank Political surveyed 256 likely Democratic caucus-goers from February 13th through February 15th. The survey results were weighted by race, gender, and age using a Random Iterative Model and the model's weighting efficiency was 84 percent, resulting in an effective sample size of 215.

Q1: If the democratic caucus for President of The United States were held today, for whom would you caucus?



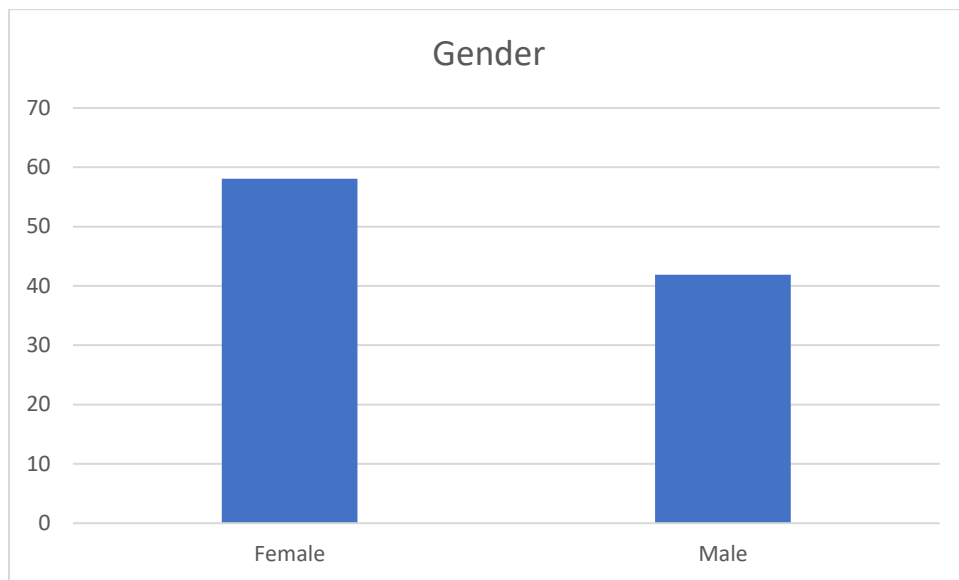

While Steyer has a slim 2-point lead, there is a tight clustering of four candidates all within the poll's margin of error. Additionally, with less than a week remaining before the February 22nd caucus, 17.1 percent of likely caucus goers are still undecided. This tight cluster of candidates, and the elevated levels

of undecided voters, suggest that the Nevada caucus is very much in the air. Tom Steyer was bolstered by strong support from Latino voters; 29.3 percent of Latino voters supported Steyer. The only other candidates to poll in double digits with Latino voters were Bernie Sanders and Pete Buttigieg, who were supported by 19.8 and 11.7 percent of Latino voters respectively.

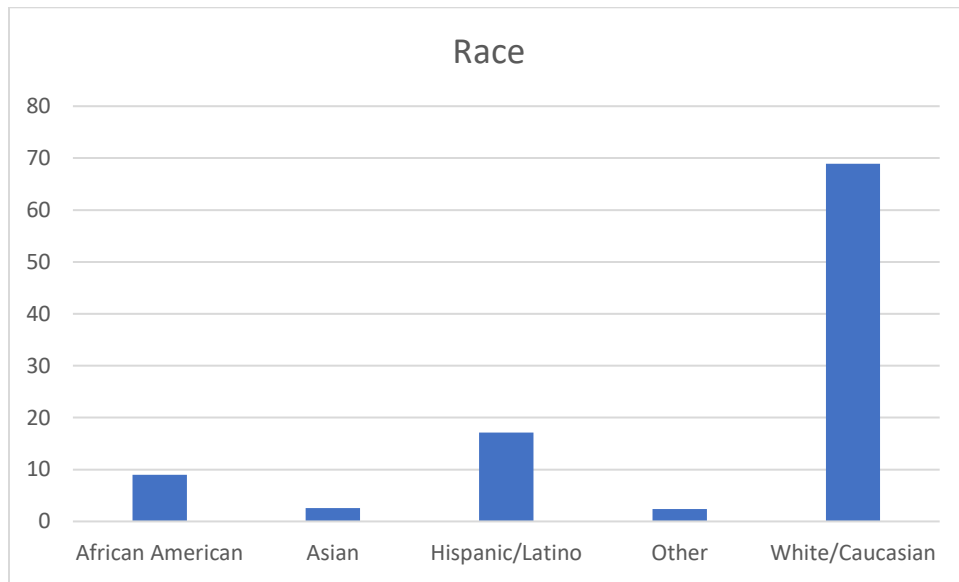
Each of the leading candidates appear to have respective bases supporting their higher standing in the polls. Steyer leads Latino voters with 29.3 percent support. Klobuchar leads with white voters with 20 percent support. Biden has a strong lead with African American voters, capturing 32.6 percent support. Sanders is buttressed by strong support from voters under the age of 40, with 33.0 percent of voters aged 18-39 choosing him. Finally, Buttigieg has strong support from older voters, earning 30 percent of voters over the age of 50.

Q2: What is your gender?



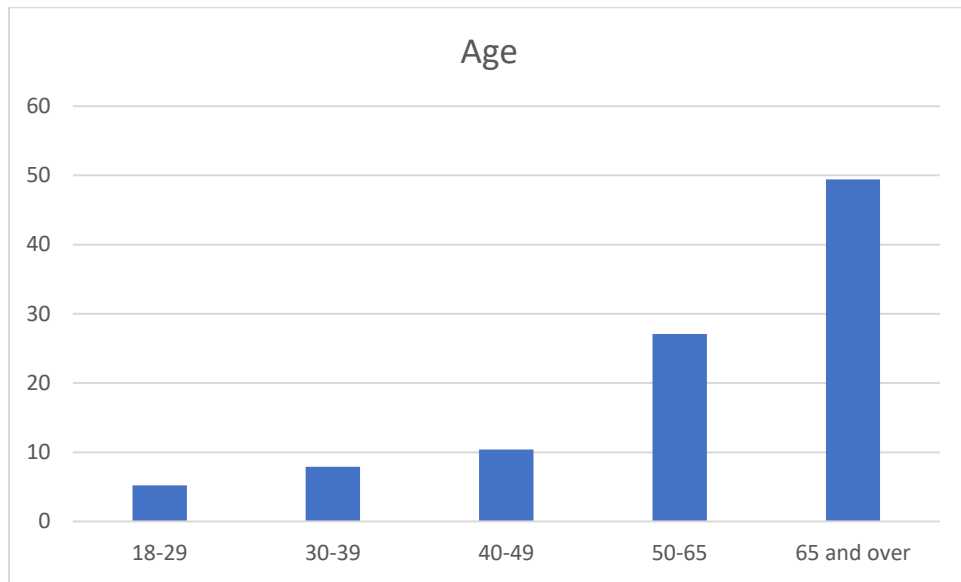
